REPORT FROM THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE UNDER SO158 (BILLS AFFECTING CHARITIES OR EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATIONS)

■ **Monken Hadley Common Bill**

Rt Hon Michael Ellis MP, Solicitor General, has made the following report to the Chairman of Ways and Means on 4 November 2020:

'Standing Order 158 of the House of Commons requires the Attorney General to provide a report on the above-mentioned bill to the House before it can be taken into consideration by the committee on the bill.

As Solicitor General, I may exercise any function of the Attorney General. I have considered the provisions of the bill and how it affects the beneficial interests in charity. There is nothing in the bill which I wish to draw to the attention of the committee.

I have written in similar terms to the Senior Deputy Speaker of the House of Lords.'
