individuals arising from, acts of terrorism; to confer related functions on the Security Industry Authority; to limit the disclosure of information about licensed premises that is likely to be useful to a person committing or preparing an act of terrorism; and for connected purposes.

Bill read the first time; to be read a second time on Monday 7 October, and to be printed (Bill 9) with Explanatory Notes (Bill 9–EN).
